History information boards in The Micro Museum cover many topics starting with the important “0” and calculating, leading through Victorian times (highlighting Babbage and Ada Lovelace). WW2 with special emphasis on Colossus and its inventor Tommy Flowers, and the 1940s to the early 21st Century.

Other topics include the contribution made to British computing by Sir Clive Sinclair and the historical firsts in gaming, sounds, graphics, robotics and computing languages.

Our exhibits show the computers and other items that helped shape the technological world we enjoy today.

We are able to provide a brief tour/talk about some of the interesting items on display.

Then, after all the learning – and teaching – have some fun playing games on the classic consoles
